## HIGH POINT AWARD NOMINATIONS

If any amateur or youth is competing on more than two horses, they are required to nominate the two horses that will count towards the high point awards. Failure to complete this will result in points being allocated for the first two horses used in the show.

If you are competing on more than two horses ensure you advise the show office prior to the commencement of the show.

## AQHA Professional Horsemen Limited Classes

Riders in these classes are required to be current financial AQHA professional horsemen limited riders.

These classes are run concurrently with the relevant age class.

Three year old horses are eligible to compete in their three year old age class and the corresponding junior limited event.

## **NSW State Show Rules 2022**

This show is run under AQHA rules

All competitors must wear safety helmet which conforms to the current Australian Safety Standards when competing in all English classes, speed classes, lead line and youth walk and jog/trot classes.

All Horses competing in the NSW State Quarter Horse Championships must be registered with the Australian Quarter Horse Association and the owner must be a financial member of the AQHA. All exhibitors must have an individual financial current membership with the AQHA

All Stabling and Camping is to be booked and paid to NPHA. For info please go to [www.npha.com.au](http://www.npha.com.au). Once entries are closed through ICompete, late entries for all events will be accepted at the Show Office on the 14<sup>th</sup> May 2022 and will incur a 25% late fee.

You may enter additional classes 2 hours prior to that class being held, no late fee will apply provided the horse is already entered in the show.

No refund of entry fees will be made after midnight on the 8<sup>th</sup> May, 2022, except in the event of the death of a horse.

Competitor packs will be available from the show office on Saturday 14<sup>th</sup> May 2022, time to be announced at the show.

All class prize money shown in programme will be paid out as follows: 1<sup>st</sup> 50%, 2<sup>nd</sup> 30% and 3<sup>rd</sup> 20%.

Feature Jackpot events prize money will be paid out on a jackpot basis of the total horses competing in the class less 40%. This money will be paid out on the following basis. 1st 50%, 2nd 30%, 3rd 20%.

In the case of outbreak of any contagious or infectious disease amongst horses, neither the SQHA nor the sponsors or show organisers will be liable for any damage or loss that may occur to any person or animal.

Dogs are welcome at SIEC but must be kept on a leash always. No dogs are allowed in the stands at the indoor arena or in the marshalling area.

Random drug testing will be done at this show. Please refer to the AQHA Official Rule Book for further rules relating to Drugs and Surgical Procedures. All horses are subject to random drug testing and all owners agree that by making their entry, they will submit their horses to be drug tested if/when requested.

Competitors realise that horse related competition has an inherent risk and as such compete at this competition at their own risk. The AQHA, SQHA and show organisers will accept no liability for accident, loss or injury. This applies to all competitors, their connections, horses and spectators.

All buildings are NO SMOKING ZONES so please observe this ruling.

First aid officers are available on the grounds during show hours. Contact the show office for details. Every horse entered for competition shall be under the control of the Show Manager or such person/s he appoints to act on his behalf.

Only contestants in the specific classes and Show Officials will be allowed in the competition arena or marshalling area during the judging.

The Show Manager or such person he/she appoints shall have discretion to eject any exhibitor from the said area for inhumane treatment and/or training of any horse or the failure to observe the Rules and Regulations of the competition and the Rules and Regulations of the AQHA or any reasonable request. Your co-operation is expected.

Show management may exclude horses from competition should there be any unnecessary or embarrassing delay on the part of the exhibitor in bringing the horse into the competition arena. It is the responsibility of the exhibitor to present themselves at the competition arena gate when called. Failure to report on final call will result in disqualification from the class. If a horse is excluded from entry, all entry fees and charges for the class are forfeited without liability to the show organisers/committee.

Show management reserve the right to change the order of classes before

or during the show. It is the responsibility of the exhibitor to be aware of any changes, which will be posted at the Show Secretary's office and announced. Every endeavour will be made to give one hour's notice of any changes to the running order of events; however, every endeavour will be made to avoid changes.



Any exhibitor or rider who refuses to obey the request of the Judge, Show Manager or any show official will be automatically disqualified from further competition at the show and forfeits all previous winnings together with all entry fees and other charges. At the discretion of the Show Manager or show committee, the offending individual and his/her entire exhibit may be removed from the grounds.

All horses must be serviceably sound. In case of suspected unsoundness, the Judge and/or Show Management, may, if he/she so desires have the animal examined by the Show Veterinarian and his decision shall be final.

Riders and handlers must be correctly attired always, including western hat/helmet and riding boots. Any person not correctly attired will not be allowed into the Marshalling arenas.

The disputes committee shall consist of the Show Manager, one Show committee member and one competitor.

Protests must be made in writing to the show secretary and be lodged within 30 minutes of the completion of the disputed event. A cash fee of \$50 must accompany any protest.

All prize money will be paid by direct deposit within 30 days of the completion of the show.

Youth ages will be as at 1st August, 2021.

If a horse is vetted out, and it has been entered for competition in a Youth event, then that youth can use a replacement horse if the replacement horse has been previously entered in the show. It should be noted that once this has taken place the horse that was vetted out is not allowed to compete in the rest of the show.

In an amateur class, if the amateur's horse is vetted out they will be permitted to use a replacement horse for that class if the replacement horse has been previously entered in the show. The replacement horse must be eligible according to the AQHA amateur rules. It should be noted that once this has taken place the horse that was vetted out is not allowed to compete in the show.

Amateur and youth competitors can nominate a maximum of only two horses that will count towards their High Point awards. If no nomination is received, then the points from the first two horses used will be included in the high point calculations.

**High point awards** will be calculated as per AQHA rules. If a tie still exists the tie breaker events will be Western Pleasure, Hunter Under Saddle and Trail in that order. For the Led High Points the tie break order will be Lungeline, HIH and Led Trail.

Competitors/participants at any event run by SQHA have a responsibility to ensure the welfare of their horses always and to treat their horses humanely and with dignity, respect and compassion. Competitors/participants are to conduct themselves in a professional manner and act with integrity in all dealings with the affiliate and other competitors, to uphold the rules and regulations of the SQHA and the AQHA at all times. Competitors/participants are to demonstrate good sportsmanship at all times, showing respect for your fellow competitors and officials, following the rules and to treat people the way you yourself wish to be treated.

All youth competing or taking part in an AQHA approved event, must have written permission from their parent/guardian to be at that event as a contestant or participant and in the case of a contestant, the parent/guardian must also give permission for the youth to compete. All youth competing or taking part in an AQHA approved event must be in the care of a responsible adult who is in attendance for the duration of that event, whilst the youth is in attendance at that event.

No alcohol is allowed in, or can be consumed, in the marshalling areas, working arenas or show pen/contest areas.
